Federal judge rules against fees at national forests

LOS ANGELES – A federal judge has ruled that the U.S. Forest Service can no longer charge fees for visitors who simply park and explore in undeveloped areas of the Cleveland, Los Padres, Angeles and San Bernardino national forests.

The Orange County Register says the decision is a victory for four hikers who contended that Southern California forests were improperly requiring them to buy an Adventure Pass even when they didn't use any developed facilities.

The Forest Service is reviewing last week's ruling by U.S. District Court Judge Terry Hatter Jr. In the meantime, visitors can park for free unless they use amenities like toilets or picnic tables.

The regional pass costs \$5 a day or \$30 annually.

The Forest Service has been overhauling fees nationwide, spurred in part by similar lawsuits.

After the long day on the trail each of the three days, entrants are invited to a sponsored BBQ to reminisce their experiences with others who have just had their own.

One word of caution for those intending to experience these trails ---- practice your smile for several days in advance. Otherwise your face will hurt by the end of each trip.



You'll want to stay for the Off Road Show on Saturday. Vendors from a very wide area display some of their wares and will aid you in the modifications to your 4X4. The 2013 Off Road Show had an estimated 3000+ visitors.



The Off-Road Motorsports Hall of Fame

The Off-Road Motorsports Hall of Fame (ORMHOF) announced today the 2014 Class of Inductees.

Del Albright, David Ashley, Marty Fiolka, the late Nye Frank, and Bill Sanders will have their names added to the venerable list of those who have committed their lives to the off-road community.

The five Inductees' widespread accomplishments cover a number of arenas in the sport including off-road racing, and acting as pioneers of the industry, journalism and advocacy. Their legacies will be celebrated and displayed for the public, in Gallery Four within the famed National Automobile Museum - the Harrah Collection- located in Reno, Nevada. They join names synonymous with the sport including Parnelli Jones, Malcolm Smith, Rob MacCachren, Larry Roeseler, Walker Evans, and Rod Hall, as well as many others who have worked tirelessly behind the scenes to make the sport prosper and grow.

The Induction Class was chosen by an eighteen-member voting panel on the basis of significant contribution to off-road motorsports- beyond wins and sport affiliation.

All nominees must have at least fifteen years of experience and involvement, as well as have built, designed, driven, maintained, owned, prepared, piloted, promoted, or ridden an off-road vehicle or supported the off-road industry. They are characterized by their desire to win, the mastery of their field, and their courage to innovate. Each Inductee has made a significant contribution to off-road motorsports in at least one of the following aspects: Business, History, Design, Engineering, Prestige of the Sport, and/or Growth of the Sport.

Cal4Wheel... Clear Creek Bill

Subcommittee to hold hearings on Clear Creek bill

On Tuesday, May 20, 2014 at 9:30 a.m. (ET) in room 1324 Longworth House Office Building, the Subcommittee on Public Lands and Environmental Regulation will hold a legislative hearing on the following bills:

- H.R. 1776 (Farr), To establish the Clear Creek National Recreation Area in San Benito and Fresno Counties, to designate the Joaquin Rocks Wilderness in such counties, to designate additional components of the national wild and scenic rivers system, and for other purposes. "Clear Creek National Recreation Area and Conservation Act"
- H.R. 2175 (Johnson, OH), To direct the Secretary of the Interior to install in the area of the World War II Memorial in the District of Columbia a suitable plaque or an inscription with the words that President Franklin D. Roosevelt prayed with the United States on June 6, 1944, the morning of D-Day. "World War II Memorial Prayer Act of 2013"
- H.R. 2489 (DeFazio), To modify the boundary of the Oregon Caves National Monument, and for other purposes. "Oregon Caves Revitalization Act of 2013"
- H.R. 3806 (Meadows), To authorize payment of funds in accordance with the agreement entered into by the Tennessee Valley Authority, the State of North Carolina, Swain County, North Carolina, and the United States Department of the Interior. "Great Smoky Mountains National Park Agreement Act of 2013"
- H.R. 4049 (Duffy), To amend the Act to provide for the establishment of the Apostle Islands
 National Lakeshore in the State of Wisconsin, and for other purposes, to adjust the boundary of
 that National Lakeshore to include the lighthouse known as Ashland Harbor Breakwater Light,
 and for other purposes. "Ashland Breakwater Light Transfer Act"
- H.R. 4272 (Walden), To stop implementation and enforcement of the Forest Service travel management rule and to require the Forest Service to incorporate the needs, uses, and input of affected communities before taking any travel management action affecting access to units of the National Forest System derived from the public domain, and for other purposes. "Forest Access in Rural Communities Act"

Pace Lake Pre-run 2014

To make some of the trips on Rock Junction a pleasure trip rather than a work trip, we must pre-run some trails to assure they will be passable, safe, and very enjoyable for our guests.

Rock Junction is three days of non-competitive trail riding on some of western Colorado and eastern Utah's premier 4-wheel drive trails from June 4th - June 6th. Trails from mild to very wild are available for those of all levels of enjoyment and skill.

Each day starts out from Grand Junction with Grand Mesa Jeep Club members leading the way to Jeeping heaven. Many of the entrants have made their annual pilgrimage in search of challenging trails on some of the most beautiful public lands in the whole U.S.


The Pace Lake road is one such trail.

Colorado winters can ravage many roads and trails in our American BackCountry. Some of the "ravaging" can provide obstacles we all look forward to. Then there is the "show-stopping" variety that require removal or "enhancing" to make them passable.

Having experienced some of the "show-stopping" variety a few years ago on two of our more difficult intermediate trails, we have taken to pre-running them to assure they are passable without the work to make them that way.

It also provides a good excuse to get out early in the spring for some post-winter exercise and Jeeping. Who needs an excuse to go Jeeping??

Historically speaking, Pace Lake requires removal of downed trees and rock falls from the road surface and some erosion mitigation.



Every two years it also requires a substantial effort to trim back paint removing scrub oak and mountain ash that have grown into the trail. This was the second year.

From the trailhead, Pace Lake is mostly 12-miles of bad road (or very good Jeep trail – depending on your view point). As you gain altitude, many layers of varying rock formations are passed through with abrupt edges and rocks from sand-size to huge to gyrate over. If you don't care for very rough trails, avoid this one. The headshake can be overwhelming.

On this pre-run, most of the work required was of the brush trimming variety. Miles of the paint scratching bushes were trimmed back to allow a safe passage for those to come.

Pace Lake will be ready to welcome our valued Rock Junction guests. There are still plenty of obstacles and severe off-camber experiences to be had, but your paint will be intact if you can stay on the trail.
